Working on Site.	<p>4 x 4 = 16</p>	<p>Where possible, please consider and implement the following practices:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) Stop all non-essential visitors 2) Introduce staggered start and finish times to reduce congestion and contact at all times 3) All employees and visitors to wash or sanitise their hands on entering and leaving the building. 4) Both Visitors and Staff will be asked to wear a face covering while moving around the building. Wearing a mask at the 'desk' will be a personal choice. 5) Allow plenty of space (two metres) between people waiting to enter building. 6) Regularly clean common contact surfaces in reception, toilets, kitchen and suites including desks, keyboards, telephones, particularly during peak times. 7) Adhere to all signage placed around the building 8) Report any concerns about others not following personal hygiene or social distancing while at work to your manager 	<p>4 x 1 = 4</p>	Individual workers

Use alcohol-based hand sanitiser if soap and water is not available and hand washing technique to be adopted as directed by NHS Avoid touching your face/eyes/nose/mouth with unwashed hands and cover your cough or sneeze with a tissue then throw it in the bin. Regularly clean the hand washing facilities and check soap and sanitiser levels Provide suitable and sufficient rubbish bins for hand towels with regular removal and disposal. Buildings will need extra supplies of soap, hand sanitiser and paper towels and these should be securely stored. Restrict the number of people using toilet facilities to one at a time. 	4 x 1 = 4	Individual workers
Working within 2 metres of colleagues and clients.	4 x 4 = 16	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> Always consider if the task can be performed differently without having to breach the 2m social distancing rule Workers are to limit face to face working and work facing away from each other when possible Limit the frequency of working within 2m to an absolute minimum and ensure it is for strictly low intensity, sporadic work where exposure to this distance is less than 15 mins All work stations and kit for example mics, desks, telephones and keyboards to be thoroughly cleaned prior and after use. 	4 x 2 = 8	Individual workers
